



Effective Leadership and Professional Development


We attract, develop and retain highly effective teachers, staff, and leaders who embrace the vision and values of our district.

5.4 Integrate and align academic, business, technology and operational systems to equitably support the needs of students, staff and schools.



The History of the Ocean View School District

Dating back to 1874, the Ocean View School District is one of the oldest school districts in Orange County. Serving all the residents of Huntington Beach, when each of today's school sites was a vegetable field, the 1875-76 school year had an Average Daily Attendance of a mere 40 students. In 1886, with a busy crop year and other factors, nobody showed up for class and the one-school district shut down for the year. Ocean View School District survived several name changes for the city it served; once referred to as "Gospel Swamp," then renamed "Shell Beach," and in 1901, "Pacific City," and, finally assumed the name Huntington Beach in 1903, in honor of H.E. Huntington who owned the Pacific Electric Railroad. As the population continued to grow, Ocean View began buying available properties. These parcels of land were leased to local farmers until they became needed for schools. OVSD went from a one-school district in the 1950s to a twenty-five school district in the 1970s. At one point, the District was growing by a classroom of students a week! The pioneers of Huntington Beach and the Ocean View School District paved the way for the award-winning, innovative educational system we have today. Today, the Ocean View School District is over 9,000 students strong! We wish to express our gratitude to all individuals who, through the years, kept detailed records and vividly recounted stories and events of our history. We hope to continue the long standing traditions begun by our predecessors. The Ocean View School District is rich in tradition and the continuation of our proud history is left to those who come after us.
